CONSULTATION PAPER ON RESERVE PRICE FOR AUCTION OF SPECTRUM IN THE 800 MHz BAND

Comments of Bharat Jyoti Consumer Advocacy Group:

Q1.The quantum of spectrum in the 800 MHz band should be same as currently available spectrum in 800 MHz band( Number of carriers actually available at hand);

Q2.The ideal block size should be 5 MHz for truly liberalized spectrum use, so that TSPs could use any technology or any service and also utilize the new technologies like UMTS,LTE;

Q3.The value of 800 MHz spectrum should be derived independently, independent of valuation of other bands viz. 1800 or 900 MHz bands;

Q4.The reserve price for 800 MHz band should not be fixed more than the 1.3 times the valuation of 1800 MHz band, as the revenue from non-voice services may still be less than 25% in the next 10 years.Morever, if the block size is not kept as 5 MHz, then more efficient technologies like UMTS and LTE can not be deployed and taken advantage of higher efficiency, to generate higher revenues.

Q5.The potential growth in data services may not be as much as assumed.So the reserve price could not be based only on assumptions;

Q7.It could be the reference but corrected proportionately as the revenue of non-voice services will still remain somewhat low in our country, for quite some time;

Q9.It should rightly be 75 to 80% of the valuation or the auction price realized, whichever is lower;
