3	Brief Description of COP Place	<p>Agartala is the capital & largest city of Tripura State. It is the second most populous city after Guwahati in Northeast India. It is India's third international internet gateway and being developed under the Smart Cities Mission. Agartala is a derivative of two words, namely agar, a valuable perfume and incense tree of genus Aquilaria, and the suffix tala, meaning underneath, a reference to the density of agarwood trees in the region. As of the 2011 Indian Census, Agartala had a total population of 400,004, of which 200,132 were males and 199,872 were females. The population within the age range of 0 to 6 year is 35,034. The total number of literates in Agartala was 344,711, which constituted 86.18% of the population with male literacy of 87.53% and female literacy of 84.82%. The effective literacy rate of 7+ population of Agartala was 94.5%, of which male literacy rate was 96.2% and female literacy rate was 92.8%. The sex ratio of Agartala is 999 females per 1,000 males.</p> <p>The COP took place in Women's Polytechnic at Hapania which is under Agartala Block and having other educational Institutes too. Bardhan appreciated the arrangement of this kind awareness program which is very relevant in today's perspective. He also highlighted about the importance of good quality network in important public places, educational institutes to bridge the digital gap.
16	Presentation by Sh. Nilay Dutta, SRO, TRAI RO Kolkata	During the programme, through a detailed presentation (by Sh. Nilay Dutta, Sr. Research Officer, TRAI), participants were educated about the provisions of different consumer centric regulations, directions and orders relating to Value Added Services (VAS), Unsolicited Commercial Communications (UCC), Mobile Number Portability (MNP), Complaint Redressal Mechanism, Data services and Tariff etc. Participants were also informed



		about the benefits of various Mobile apps (TRAI My Speed app, TRAI DND 3.0 app and TRAI Mycall app), Tariff portal, Drive tests undertaken by TRAI to monitor QoS and Network coverage maps developed by TRAI for consumer empowerment and how consumers can take advantage of these apps /portals. The COP theme 'Quality of Service' was highlighted among the audience. Participants were also briefed on various recommendations made by TRAI to facilitate growth of telecommunication and about TRAI's new regulations/ Directions on UCC and how they should be extra careful about different telecom fraud like tower fraud, fraudulent message/ calls etc.										
17	Address by Sh. Ankit Shaw, JTO, DoT, Tripura	A brief overview on Sanchar Saathi portal (sancharsaathi.gov.in, a citizen centric portal of the Department of Telecom, was delivered by Sh. Ankit Shaw, JTO during the COP session. The discussion dealt with various tools such as "Chakshu" (fraud communication), CEIR (Lost or stolen mobile), TAFCOP (No. Of mobile connections) etc, which are part of Sanchar Saathi portal. The presentation also contained the details on 'Electro Magnetic Radiation' in Telecom infrastructure.										
18	Address by Sh. Titan Paul, SI, the representative from Cyber Crime Cell, Tripura Police,	Sh. Paul, as a domain Expert, delivered a session on cyber hygiene related do's and don'ts. In his interaction with the audience. In his speech, Sh. Paul discussed the various cyber frauds, where to report the incidence, if fraudsters duped the people and he answered the cyber-crime related queries raised by the participants.										
19	Introduction of TSPs	All the TSPs in Tripura set up their individual Customer Service kiosk at the COP venue alongwith their representatives. In the Kiosk, the TSP representatives informed about their nearest Customer Service Centre, details of Appellate Authority, their operating PoP located in Agartala and it's nearest places etc.										
20	Interactive session	Consumers raised different issues, complaints during the interactive session. All the complaints were recorded by the respective TSPs and it was requested to all the TSPs to resolve the issues at the earliest.




Classification of participants based on their age, gender, education, and profession:




