STATE OF INDIAN TELECOM NETWORK

Telecom Regulatory Authority of India today released a Study Paper on "State of

Indian Telecom Network". TRAI has been receiving complaints about poor quality of

service, call drops, congestion etc., on the telecom networks. TRAI has been very

concerned about the deterioration in quality of service and has issued press releases and

reports on network congestion for the CMSPs for the month of August (released on 17<sup>th</sup>

October 2005) and July, 2005 (released on 4<sup>th</sup> October 2005). The network conditions

have also deteriorated due to the inability of the mobile operators to set up adequate

towers and cell sites in cities. TRAI released a report on this problem with specific

reference to Lutyen's Delhi on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2005 and would shortly release a report on

this problem vis-à-vis other cities of the country.

The study report released by TRAI today gives the entire background of the

problem of poor connectivity and has appealed to the operators to reduce the time taken

for providing interconnectivity.
